Some short steep slopes and a long gradual climb into King's Wood.



## Brief Route Details / Points of Particular Interest

This route starts with a walk through Drybridge Community Nature Park, then across Vauxhall Fields to Ancrehill Lane. After crossing Rockfield Road it continues across several fields to join the Offa's Dyke Path as it climbs up into King's Wood. You turn left off the national trail at a crossroads and continue to the edge of the wood on a broad track. There are good views as you leave the wood and descend to Monmouth through farmland.

Points of interest include views towards the Black Mountains and Brecon Beacons.
